- ▶ Volunteer at a daycare, baby sitting (for free).
- ▶ Work at local food bank or shelter (e.g. Redmond Hopelink).
- ▶ Work at animal shelters (e.g. Humane Society).
- ▶ Check with local church, faith or cultural organizations.

## Purpose

The purpose of Honor Society is to create an enthusiasm for superior scholarship; to develop citizenship; to stimulate a desire to serve; to promote leadership; and to instill exemplary qualities of character.

- ▶ Eligible students are invited to apply in February based on first semester grade reports.
- ▶ You must complete at least 15 hours of school and/or community service to qualify for membership or to maintain membership status.



## Requirements

- ▶ 3.6 or higher GPA from most recent semester grade report card
- ▶ Commitment/involvement in school and community service
- ▶ Demonstrate citizenship and character

Hours should be documented on Honor Society community service slips, which can be found in the Student Services Office (just inside the door on the end of the counter).

Turn in completed slips to the Honor Society turn-in box on the Student Services office counter.

Check the Honor Society PSL for individual hours and meeting times. The PSL page will be updated regularly.

## Service

Service is generally considered to be those actions undertaken by the student, which are done with or on behalf of others without any direct financial or material compensation to the individual performing the service. The student who serves:

1. Volunteers and provides dependable and well organized assistance;
2. Works well with others;
3. Is willing to represent the school positively;
4. Shows courtesy by assisting visitors, teachers, and students.
